

## The book editors



- For each table, please supply a table caption (title) explaining the components of the table.



# Chapter 15 Research on Interpolation Methods and Fitting Models for the Lorenz Curve

Abstract The Lorenz curve is very important to show the income distribution for a country. Based on the work of other scholars, this chapter at first discusses some existing interpolation methods and points out their shortcomings. To overcome the existence of higher-order derivatives for Lagrange interpolation, this paper sets up one method and makes some analyses about the methods. Then, a new family of Lorenz curves is suggested and the corresponding properties discussed. With collected income data from some regions in China, statistical indices show better results compared with other existing curves.



#### 4 Conclusions and Discussion

In this paper, we provide the background of the Lorenz curve and the Gini coefficient. The basic relationship between the Lorenz curve and Gini coefficient is described. Then, some transformation formulas for the density function and the distribution function are presented. Based on the graphicical character of arch function, we propose a new method to construct a family of Lorenz curves and show some properties of it. With the collected income data in China, some computations about parameter estimation and error analysis are completed. The results show that our models are superior.
